These are some of the grandma emoji in celebration of World Emoji Day on July 17th!







NATIONAL LIPSTICK DAY - JULY 29TH






Who Received an A+ at College of Marin?

Grow a Backbone!



HIP CIRCLES ARE A GREAT WAY TO HELP AN ACHING BACK!




Sitting all day is not a normal thing for people to be doing. Hip circles help us increase circulation and take a break from sitting on our behinds!


Dylan shows his artistic talent and eye for color with some vehicular art!



COMETS AND THE KUIPER BELT



A) The main part of the Kuiper Belt begins at which planet's orbit?

The Oort Cloud is an even more distant, spherical region of icy, comet-like bodies that surrounds the solar system, including the Kuiper Belt. But both the Oort Cloud and the Kuiper Belt are thought to be sources of comets.

This photo (to the right) shows C/2020 F8 (SWAN), or Comet SWAN, an Oort cloud comet that was discovered in images taken by the Solar Wind Anisotropies (SWAN) camera on March 25, 2020, aboard the Solar Heliospheric Observer (SOHO) spacecraft. Cool beans!

Vanessa and Harold taught us about the Kuiper Belt which is vast, cold, mysterious, and dark. The Kuiper Belt is one of the largest structures in our solar system—others being the Oort Cloud, the heliosphere and the magnetosphere of Jupiter. Its overall shape is like a puffed-up disk, or donut. Its inner edge begins at about 30 AU from the Sun. (1 AU, or astronomical unit, is the distance from Earth to the Sun.) The inner, main region of the Kuiper belt ends to around 50 AU from the Sun.



Upside-Down Face

JULY 17 IS INTERNATIONAL EMOJI DAY

A classic smiley, turned upside down. Implemented as a flipped version of <a> Slightly Smiling Face on most platforms.

Commonly used to convey irony, sarcasm, joking, or a sense of goofiness or silliness. Its intent can be similar to the bemused *Oh well!* of \P Person Shrugging or the *shruggie* emoticon, $\()\) / \$.







Star-Struck

Can Alison still teach Zoom classes if she moves to Oregon at the end of July?




The Oregon Trail

The Oregon Trail was laid by fur traders and trappers from about 1811 to 1840, and was only passable on foot or by horseback. By 1836, when the first migrant wagon train was organized in Independence, Missouri. Wagon trails eventually reached all the way to the Willamette Valley in Oregon, thus completing the Oregon Trail.

The Oregon Trail Computer Game Debuts in 1971

The Oregon Trail is a series of educational computer games. The original game was designed to teach school children about the realities of 19th-century pioneer life on the Oregon Trail. The game was popular among elementary school students worldwide from the mid-1980s to mid-2000s. The phrase below was popularized on t-shirts and merchandise!

- Oregon is the ghost town capital of the US, with over 80 ghost towns!
 Idiotville is a ghost town and former community located in Tillamook
 County in Oregon near the mouth of Idiot Creek on the Wilson River.
- Oregon is the only state that has an official state nut-the hazelnut. The hazelnut is also known as the filbert. Oregon grows 99 percent of the entire U.S. commercial crop.



 The name "Oregon" is believed to have come from French word ouragan (meaning "windstorm" or "hurricane"). It refers to the powerful chinook winds of the Columbia River.
